A Board Member reported that the County recently sprayed for mosquitoes. She explained that traps are set in the trees and are periodically checked by the County for mosquito infestations and, if detected, spraying occurs at no charge to the CDD. Residents bitten by mosquitos can contact the County and ask them to spray their neighborhood.

Discussion ensued regarding incidences of malaria in Florida, the CDD assuming responsibility for mosquito control, the property tax bill, ponds, Miami Curb Cleaning, sidewalks, Brazilian pepper tree overgrowth at Hole 6, regulating ownership of pepper tree plants, the bridge near Holes 16 and 17, purchasing a larger mower, mower costs, debris and weed removal in Paleo Park.
